Curriculum Transformation What is it?

- A redesign of course structure and possibly content
- Aims to overhaul outdated teaching structures and adopt more innovative approaches to learning







Curriculum Transformation How does this affect PAL?

- Students may ask for support with course content or assessments that you haven't encountered
- We want to reemphasise that your role as a PAL Leader isn't to teach, it's to facilitate learning
